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What is the Medicare Prescription Drug Program?

This Program is available to those who are eligible for Medicare. It provides insurance coverage for prescription drugs and offers a choice of plans. As with other types of insurance, monthly premiums and out-of-pocket costs vary depending on the plan chosen.

October 15, 2025, open enrollment for 2026 begins December 7, 2025, open enrollment for 2026 ends January 1, 2026, coverage begins

Emergency Home Response Systems:

Emergency Home Response Service is a 24 hour emergency communication link to assistance outside the home for older adults. This service is provided by a two-way voice communication system, with a base unit connected to a land line telephone and a cell phone in certain circumstances, and an activation device worn by the older adult. When activated, the older adult is automatically linked to a professionally staffed support center for assistance.

When looking at a facility these are some things to keep in mind regarding each Long-Term Care Facility:

- Care Practice: How staff care for the individual. When thinking about what is important for your loved one and what you expect from their life at a Long-Term Care Facility.
- Environment: How the space around us looks can affect how we feel about the place.
- Dining: It is not just about food; it is also an opportunity for socializing as well as enjoying your meal.
- Everyday Life: How you spend your personal time is your choice, but having a good quality of day-to-day activities is very achievable while in a Long-Term Care Facility.
- Culture Change: This is directed to the Home's awareness and commitment to person centered/direct care. Ask about the facility's Resident Council.
- Staff turnover is a method of measuring staff satisfaction.
- Longevity of the Administrator and Director of Nursing.
- Staff to resident ratios should be compared between facilities.


