Solicitation for Letter of Intent

Adult Protective Services Program

Midland Area Agency on Aging is accepting "letters of intent" to apply for the designation of Adult Protective Services Program for Fiscal Year 2023 July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 in the areas listed below:

5 County Region consisting of Clay, Effingham, Fayette, Marion, and Jefferson Counties

This agency should be a non-profit and local government organization who is qualified to receive Federal and State of Illinois grants. Successful applicants must comply with all applicable prequalification requirements, including but not limited to, current DUNS and SAM numbers, acceptable fiscal management stability, and are in good standing with the Secretary of State and are not on any Debarred/Suspended/Stop Payment listings.

Adult Protective Services (APS) is a social services program to support older adults and adults with disabilities experiencing abuse, neglect, self-neglect, or financial exploitation. APS programs investigate reports of maltreatment; provide support and, in some cases, case-management; and connect those facing abuse to a variety of protective, emergency, and support services.

The service provider must adhere to the Illinois Department on Aging's Adult Protective Services Standards and Procedures and Midland Area Agency's General Service Requirements.

"Letters of intent" are due at Midland Area Agency, 434 S. Poplar, Centralia, IL 62801 or emailed to office@midlandaaa.org on or before close of business on Monday February 28, 2022. The Area Agency on Aging will not respond to a "letter of intent" which is received after the deadline.

The Area Agency will forward a proposal package to each agency which submits a timely "letter of intent". However, submission of a "letter of intent" and receipt of a proposal package does not obligate an agency to continue participation in the procurement.
